My name is Joseph Cotter, and I am a member of your community.

In 1982, Ms. Jensen walked her 5th grade class across the street (Rt. 352) from East Goshen Elementary School. The multi-lane, multi light intersection now at 352 and Paoli Pike was nothing more than a stop sign.

It was a field trip to the property on the other side of Rt. 352 that was owned by Smith Kline Beecham. I was very impressed with the demonstration they put on. My grandfather often said "Joey saw a cow with a window in it" because in fact, there was a cow with a diagnostic panel on it's side.

The community kids rode our bicycles to the township park, which was much smaller than it is now. Across the street was the Applebrook Farm where I distinctly remember a barn for the cows which I believe is still there and re-purposed as a golf course maintenance facility.

Later, both the Smith Kline facility and the Applebrook Golf Course were developed around the same time. The community really changed at that point, it was beautified when the Smith Kline facility was added to our East Goshen township park and Applebrook was developed into its current form.

And then came a famous Applebrook resident: Earnest Borgnine.

Ernest Borgnine was one of the most recognizable American actors of the 20th century. He won the Academy Award for Best Actor in 1955.

He was much more than a beloved entertainer. During the Second World War, he served aboard ships involved in Atlantic anti-submarine patrol duty and reached the rank of Gunner's Mate, First Class. My father, who himself was drafted and served as a Military Police Officer in Germany in 1953, was a huge fan. Mr. Borgnine could be seen nearly every single day in the Wawa located walking distance from Applebrook. I met him several times there and he was a warm personality.

He started to appear around the time I lost my father, little did he know how close they were to meeting. . .

Instead of having a golf classic honoring Ernest Borgnine, an American war hero, you are instead deleting his legacy and rewriting the future through your support of illegal aliens at Community Volunteers in Medicine.
